A Church With A Vision

She asks, "Would you tell me, please, which way I ought to walk from here?" "That depends a good deal on where you want to get to," said the cat. These lines from Lewis Carroll's *Alice in Wonderland* are rich with meaning. It's true; action without vision is random activity. As we begin a new season in the church, it can be said that Trinity United Methodist is one with a vision.

The leadership of Trinity is committed to take our church to the next level. This is a collective effort however, and everywhere I look there is evidence of ambitious people working diligently to expand our ministry to the Springfield community and beyond.

Vision can be summarized by this wonderful story told by Edward Pulling, a great educator: Back in the Middle Ages, a dispatcher went out to determine how laborers felt about their work. He went to a building site in France. He approached the first worker and asked, "What are you doing?" The worker snapped back, "Are you blind? I'm cutting these impossible boulders with primitive tools and putting them together the way the boss tells me. I'm sweating under this blazing sun, it's backbreaking work, and it's boring me to death!"

The dispatcher quickly backed off and retreated to a second worker. He asked the same question: "What are you doing?" The worker replied, "I'm shaping these boulders into usable forms, which are to be assembled according to the architect's plan. It's hard work, and sometimes it gets repetitive, but I earn five francs a week, and that supports my wife and children. It's a job. Could be worse."

Somewhat encouraged, the dispatcher went on to a third worker. "What are you doing?" he asked. "Why can't you see!" said the worker as he lifted his arms to the sky. "I'm building a cathedral!" Friends, whatever we do, let us do it with purpose and with vision. For we are building a church for the glory of God!




ELIZABETH BAKER Fall Study Opportunity - Living with Eeyore

SUNDAY OCTOBER 6, 2024, WE WALK!

The 48TH Annual Greater Springfield CROP Hunger Walk will take place here at Trinity! Since we started walking, our Walk has raised \$592,924.15 to support families all over the world, and this year Team Trinity's goal is to have 30 Walkers raise \$4,000 to support families and communities around the world and here in the Springfield area.

You have provided generational farmers livestock like cows, chickens, and pigs who are able to utilize the animals waste as compost fertilizer and improve the quality of their crops. You have helped Ukrainian refugees feel welcome and receive support they need as they have been forced to flee their homes. Your support has brought water into communities, so the children, especially the young girls are able to go to school, instead of walking miles to fetch water every day. Your support is helping our neighbors here in the Springfield area who receive support from Open Pantry, Lorraine's Soup Kitchen, and the Western Mass Food Bank.

"I Am the Vine; You Are the Branches."

Our theme for the year is branches and our guiding scripture: "I am the vine; you are the branches." Jesus tells us this in John 15:5a. He goes on to talk about the connection, the vine and the branches, and how they need one another. "Abide in me and I abide in you" he tells us.

As we consider the connections through branches this year we would like to use a visual that is already in our sanctuary and has been there since it was dedicated in 1929. The front piece of our altar includes three circles of grapevines, each around symbols of the Trinity. The circular vine pictured above surrounds symbols of Jesus.

The Worship Committee invites you to come into the altar area after church one Sunday and spend some time looking at the vine and the branches on the altar. What do you see? How do you feel about being one of the branches? How can you strengthen your connection to the vine, to Jesus and to God? May God be with us as we live into our theme this year.


Craig Masonry is repointing the exterior masonry on the west wall of the chapel. Bob Craig has repaired the exterior window at the top of the stairs to the bell tower. He has repaired some areas where the limestone has failed. In the picture Bob Craig is repointing the chimney.



Stained Glass Resources has removed the 5 sanctuary aisle stained glass windows and the four large stained glass windows at the west transept and rear balconies. Attached is a picture of one of the aisle windows that has been taken apart, cleaned, missing or damaged glass repaired and then re-lead the glass.









Three new small point of use electric hot water heaters have been installed under sinks that are a long distance from the main hot water tank in the boiler room.

Asphalt paving was placed on the west exit driveway in the area of the potholes.

Construction on Sumner Ave has started with the installation of a new high pressure large gas line which an Eversource spokesperson suggested Trinity Church should have plenty of natural gas in the future. In the past the boiler has shutdown due to low natural gas pressure. An Eversource contractor will be installing new electric lines under Sumner Ave. The contractor plans to rent 4 parking spaces on the West exit driveway to store equipment for 2-3 months.
