**A Time To Give**



James Kennedy once said, “What really matters is what happens in us, not to us.” Sometimes, we don’t feel we have that much to give others. We may be struggling financially. Our health might not be the best. We may feel too tired, physically and emotionally, to add even one more activity to our busy schedule.

In reality however, we all have a great deal to give, whatever our circumstances. For instance, we can listen when someone needs to talk. We can call someone who may be lonely. We can forgive someone who has hurt us. We can teach a skill or share our knowledge. We can even offer something as simple as a smile. It has been said that the ultimate test of an individual’s character may be their willingness to sacrifice for future generations whose words of thanks may not be heard. Indeed, we all have more than we think to give to the world.

On Sunday, October 13, 2024, Trinity will be launching its Annual Fall Stewardship Campaign, and you are invited to participate in it.

Church fundraising campaigns are double-edged swords. If the purpose is not important and clearly understood, it may create a wave of fear that a person will be personally asked for money that he or she would rather not give. This fear creates a secondary wave of fear that participation of persons may diminish in an effort of self protection. On the other hand, if the purpose is important and clearly understood, a church fundraising campaign can bring about a sense of personal exhilaration with renewed and amplified commitment to the church.

On the congregational group level, the result is pride and excitement from seeing good things happen. Furthermore, there is reasonable anticipation of better things happening in the future. I believe the purpose of our stewardship campaign is clear and clearly understood. You are invited to invest yourself through the resources that God has given you - your energy, your prayers, and your gifts. *We all have a great deal to give; and we are all needed to give whatever we can to help make Trinity be the best it can possibly be for generations to come, and to expand God’s realm of radical inclusion, love, compassion, and justice; a realm that Jesus inaugurated and proclaimed. Please watch for more details about the campaign in the very near future!*

### Thoughts on our Theme of Branches Inspired by Trinity's Altar

Wreaths of grapevines are central to our Altar. The design of the Altar was the idea of the Rev. Dr. F. W. Adams, who also had the vision of building Trinity on Sumner Ave. By using the image of the grapevines he made certain the Altar would always remind us of Jesus' statement in the Gospel of John, "I am the vine, you are the branches."

The picture above is the section of the Altar that focuses on God. Notice the square with a border of two-colored cord (lighter and darker shades of orange). The cord is another symbol indicating our connection with God, symbolizing humankind and God as "inseparably woven together." (Fletcher, p. 5)

Adams' decision to surround each symbol of the Trinity with the branches of a grapevine also reminds us of the Triune God: Creator, Son, and Holy Spirit. Each provides us a path to the Holy. What are some of the ways that you connect to the Trinity? Quiet meditation with God? Listening for the Holy Spirit? Spending time with the Gospels that you might learn about God through Jesus? Wherever you are in your spiritual journey, remember, you are already connected to God, you are inseparably woven together.

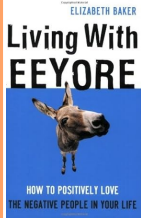

### Women's Book Club

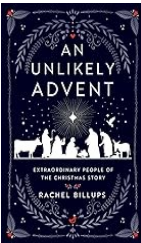

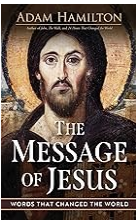
### Fall Study Opportunity - Living with Eeyore
